About Us

Community Smiles Dental is a non-profit 501(c)(3) organization providing crucial dental care to low-income children, pregnant women, special needs patients, and adults in the Greater Milwaukee area. We continue to place our primary emphasis on serving youth, who disproportionately struggle with access to dental treatment and have nowhere else to turn.

Financial Details

Community Smiles Dental operates with thorough fiscal responsibility and an annual budget of more than \$2 million. Roughly 60% of the budget comes from the generosity of the community. Annually, more than \$1 million in donations is required to help us serve 4,000 individuals.

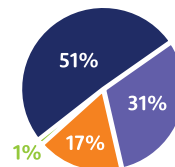

Patient Demographics



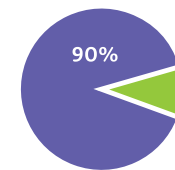
Waukesha Clinic

100% of Waukesha clinic patients are Waukesha County Residents



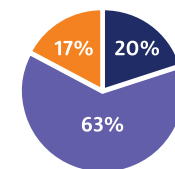
Menomonee Falls Clinic (as of 2020)

1% Ozaukee County



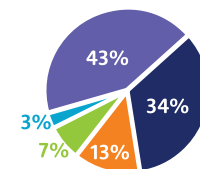
Youth
